School will be open on Wednesday, August 19, 2009, beginning at 8:30 a.m., with a full day of classes. Upon arrival at school the first day, kindergarten will report directly to their room. Grades 1-6 will line up in front of the old building and the classroom teachers will meet them there. Grades 7-12 will report to the new gym at 8:30 for general information and instructions from our Jr./Sr. High Principal Mr. Sam Swenson.

FARRAGUT PRESCHOOL FOR 2009-2010

Farragut 3 and 4 Year Old Preschool Programs - This year we are holding an evening Preschool meeting, hopefully, making it easier for parents to attend. There will be a meeting for the 3 year old and 4 year old Preschool programs Monday, August 17, at 7:30 PM in the Media Center. Information will be shared about the programs, tuition grants through Corner Counties Empowerment, transportation, home visitations, and parent support. If we do not already have a copy of the birth certificate and immunizations, please bring them with you to the meeting. Babysitting will be provided.

Preschool classes will begin Monday, August 31. The 4 Year Old Preschool class will be held on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday from 8:20-3:20 each day. The 3 Year Old Preschool class will be held on Tuesday and Friday from 8:20-11:00 each day. Cost for 4 year old preschool is \$85.00 per month and 3 year old preschool will be \$35.00 per month. Transportation will also be offered, if needed, for \$35.00 per month.

Please call the school 385-8131 to enroll your preschooler if you have not already done so.

SCHOOL FEES

The school district charges fees for certain items, such as textbook rental, authorized by Iowa Code in sections 280.10, 280.11, 282.6, 285.1, 279.8A and 301.1. Students whose families meet the income guidelines for free and reduced price lunch, the Family Investment Program (FIP), transportation assistance under open enrollment, or students who are in foster care are eligible to have their student fees waived or partially waived. Students whose families are experiencing a temporary financial difficulty may be eligible for a temporary waiver of student fees. Parents or students who believe they may qualify for temporary financial hardship should contact the secretary at registration for a waiver form. This waiver does not carry over from year to year and must be completed annually.

School registration is held several days prior to the first day of school. This registration period is published and broadcast over the local media. All students are assessed a \$15.00 fee, with a maximum of \$60.00 per family for textbook, software, worksheet and student planner upon registration. The monies for this fund are deposited in the general budget account code for these purchases. Program fees, pupil insurance, athletic insurance, hot lunch, and other fees associated with extracurricular activities should be paid upon registration. Students whose families meet the income guidelines for free and reduced lunch need to pick up a free/reduced lunch form from the office or complete the forms included in the August school newsletter. Free/reduced lunch guidelines are published annually; therefore, forms must be filed in our office annually as well. Parents or students who believe they qualify for some other program need to contact Mrs. Becky Hughes, Mrs. Pam Nebel or the Superintendent.

TO REPORT HARASSMENT

The Farragut Community School District will make every effort to protect students and staff from harassment or sexual harassment. School officials will investigate reports of lewd or suggestive comments, obscene gestures, unwanted touching, unwarranted advances, graffiti, threatening behavior, or other harassing behavior. A student or parent wishing to file a complaint of harassment by another student or school employee may file a complaint with the Level One Investigators, Mrs. Penny Bredensteiner or Mr. Sam Swenson. The Level Two Investigator is the County Sheriff or Fremont County Attorney. Please call the school at (712) 385-8131 to report harassment.

TO REPORT ABUSE

A person who thinks that a school employee has physically or sexually abused a student may contact the school's Level-One Investigators, Mrs. Penny Bredensteiner or Mr. Sam Swenson at (712) 385-8131.

OPT-OUT

No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 Section 9528 requires that high schools must provide military recruiters access to student names, addresses and telephone listings. Parents or 18 year old students can ask for a form to "Opt-Out" of student recruitment. The choice can be made to not meet with athletic, college or military recruiters.

SCHOOL INSURANCE

School Accident Insurance will be available through Student Assurance Services, Inc. Several variations are available. Football insurance 9-12 will cost \$189.00. However, the school shares in paying one-half of the amount due, which is \$94.50. We are not insisting that all football players carry these plans. If the family feels they have adequate coverage at home, there is no need for this coverage.

Insurance leaflets are enclosed in this package, including all school-time and interscholastic sports prices. Please have the student return the insurance leaflet, whether or not you want your child to be insured. We need complete records of who does or does not have insurance. We encourage you carrying school insurance particularly if you do not carry health and accident insurance at home. The school nurse will handle all insurance claims and information.

ELEMENTARY UPDATE- PENNY BREDENSTEINER

It's here, the start of another year! The building is almost ready to go for the start of school August 19. The staff and I look forward to greeting our students, those new and those returning. Additions to many of the elementary rooms are Promethean Boards, interactive boards for instruction.

Registration for elementary students will be August 10-14 from 8:00-4:30. Becky or Pam will take care of the fees. The student fee remains the same, but breakfast and lunch prices have changed.

The teachers are excited that we can again have a Back to School Night Tuesday, August 18, from 5:30 to 6:30. Students can bring in their school supplies, find their desks, and meet their teachers before the first day of school. This gives teachers the opportunity to meet their students, meet parents, share some information, sign parents up for the various parties, and get emergency contact information.

Preschool parents will receive a letter detailing the program design this year. The PreK (4yr. old) class will meet on Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday all day. The Three Year Old Preschool students will attend Tuesday and Friday mornings from 8:20-11:00. There are tuition grants available through Corner Counties Empowerment Area.

It looks to be a great year! Feel free to call the office with any questions you may have about the coming school year.

BAD CHECKS - ATTENTION:

The Board of Education has approved an administrative policy towards bad checks. A bad check made in the amount of under \$100 will warrant a phone call to secure funds on the next business day. More than one bad check in the amount under \$100 during a school year will be considered a major transgression. A bad check made in the amount of over \$100 will receive a letter from the superintendent asking for immediate payment and cash or money orders used for the next 90 school days. Bad checks are immediately sent to a recovery service. Multiple bad checks will cause forbidding of checks accepted at the school.

AUGUST 2009 SECONDARY PRINCIPAL NEWSLETTER

Once again, summer has gone by us too fast and we are about ready to start a new school year. A reminder to Jr. High and High school students of things to think about before the 2009-2010 school year begins. You need to get those physicals taken care of before you can start practice. Make sure you remind your parents to get you registered for school during registration, which will be held the week of August 10-14. Also stop in the high school office to get your schedule taken care of, as some of you have some conflicts that need to be resolved. For all 7th grade and new students, we will have orientation on August 18th from 5:30-6:30, and parents are welcome and encouraged to attend.

There are also some changes and reminders that students and parents should be aware of. Any student arriving after 8:30 will need to check into the office or will be sent to the office for admittance. When a student arrives after 8:30, they must have a parent or guardian excuse. If the student cannot provide a parent or guardian excuse, the period will count as an unexcused absence instead of a tardy and will count toward their 15 days of absences allowed. One of the most important issues contributing to the success of your student is attendance of the school day. The school asks that if you know your student will not be in school please call the school by 9:00 a.m. the day of the absence. If you do not call, the school may notify you of your student's absence. If your student has more than 10 absences, we will ask that you provide proof of illness, appointment or emergency in order that the absence may be excused. Students may receive only 50% credit for unexcused absences. Along with attendance, it is important that your student not be late.

Electronic technology such as cell phones, iPods, cameras, and other devices, that many students have, are reminded if they choose to bring them to school, they need to be shut off and kept in their school bags preferably locked up. If you choose to bring these items to school, the school is not responsible if they are stolen.

There is a strong connection between academic performance, student's appearance and student's conduct. Inappropriate student appearance may cause material and substantial disruption to the school environment or present a threat to the health and safety of students, employees and visitors on school grounds. Students are expected to adhere to reasonable levels of cleanliness and modesty. Students are expected to wear clothing that is appropriate to their age level that does not disrupt the school or educational environment.

Guidelines for proper Attire-

1. When shorts are worn, they need to be mid-thigh or longer in length.
2. Halter-tops should not be worn to school.
3. Bicycle shorts are not permitted as outer garments.
4. Shirts with pictures or words that are inappropriate for students should not be worn. This includes, but is not limited to, shirts or pants advertising beer or tobacco and using profane, sexual, or violent language. Students should not wear clothing with pictures, words, or slogans that are racist, or infer, suggest, hint, or imply an obscenity or sexual innuendo. Students will be required to turn the shirt inside out or change into something more acceptable. A second offense may result in suspension.
5. The midriff for both boys and girls must be covered.
6. Mesh shirts and tank tops should not be worn to school as the only shirt worn; shirts must have a 2 inch sleeve.
7. Students are not to wear shoe-skates for safety reasons.
8. For safety, shoes that are open-toed and slip on are not recommended for elementary students because of the stairs.
9. Students are to wear tennis shoes for P.E.
10. Chains, collars with spikes and safety pins are not allowed at school.

11. Hats are not to be worn in the building during the school day.

MILK FEE

The price for afternoon milk for Kindergarten and 1st grade students will be \$20.00 per semester or \$40.00 for the whole year. This is payable when you register for school.

BUS ROUTES

Bus routes will be about the same as last year. During registration, pick up an approximate time that the bus will be there the first day. Please have your children ready early the first day or so until the schedules are firmly established. If you are new to the district, check with a neighbor or call the school about what time the bus will arrive. If you have not registered your new students by the time you receive this letter, please do so as soon as possible so they can be placed on a bus route.

LOCKS

Every student that uses a locker in a dressing room in Grades 7-12 will be issued a lock. There will be no charge for this lock unless the student fails to turn in the lock. If the lock is not turned in, a fee of \$5.00 will be charged to replace the lock. The student is responsible for the lock from the time of issue until return. Parents, please insist that your children keep their lockers locked any time there is anything of any value in them. We try to keep mysterious disappearances to a minimum, but your child must cooperate and keep his/her possessions in a safe place. If students will always lock their lockers, losses of articles and locks will be greatly reduced. School locks are to be used by all students so that coaches can help them open them with a master key in emergencies.

KINDERGARTEN SCHEDULE

Kindergarten will run all day, every day as always, with students picked up and delivered by the regularly scheduled buses for all the students.

SCHOOL PICTURES

School pictures will be taken on Thursday, September 3 for Pre-K-11 students. Preschoolers and any other students not in school will be taken at 8:30 a.m. Information will be handed out prior to picture day. If paying by check, PLEASE MAKE CHECK PAYABLE TO INTER-STATE STUDIO.

MONTHLY NEWSLETTER

The school will publish a monthly newsletter at the beginning of each month. If there are particular items that you would like to see in this newsletter, please offer your suggestions to the building principals. We would like to have this letter provide the information that you desire. Articles you want in the newsletter must be in to Pam by the 3rd Monday of the month. This will include a calendar of two month's school activities for your convenience.

POST-SECONDARY ENROLLMENT OPTION

Students in grades 11 and 12, for courses approved by the Board of Education on a case-by-case basis, will be reimbursed for tuition and other costs directly related to the course up to \$250. These costs will not be reimbursed to the student if enrolled full-time in the post-secondary institution. The following factors shall be considered in the reimbursement of Post-Secondary tuition and in the board's determination whether a student will receive high school credit for a course at a post secondary institution:

- *The course must be taught at a public or accredited private institution;
- *A comparable course is not offered in the school district;
- *The course must be a credited course at the post-secondary institution;
- *The course is not religious or sectarian.

Prior to taking a course at a post-secondary educational institution, students must receive the approval of the Board to receive credit toward the graduation requirements set out by the Board. Failure to successfully complete the course will result in the student reimbursing up to \$250.00 tuition cost. See Mrs. Deana Swenson, Guidance Counselor, for additional information.

SCHOOL DISMISSALS AND CLOSINGS

School closings and early dismissals will be announced on KMA-960 on the a.m. dial. We will make these announcements as soon as possible after a decision has been made. We always try to get early morning announcements on the air by 6:30 a.m. Please listen to the radio when there is question as to whether or not school will be in session. DO NOT call the radio station for information. They will announce information as soon as they receive it and have no way of knowing what is being planned until we call them.

JH/HS PHYSICALS

Just a reminder that if you are planning on going out for any sport this coming school year, you must have a physical on file at the school. These physicals must be completed before you will be allowed to practice.

LABELING OF BELONGINGS

Would all parents please see that any clothing, shoes, notebooks, or other school materials that are needed are properly labeled with your child's identification prior to bringing them to school. This should reduce loss and theft both.

SEASON TICKETS

Season ticket prices will be \$50.00 for a single pass and \$125.00 for a family for all regularly scheduled home games. A single admission is \$5.00 for adults & \$3.00 for students. Season tickets will be on sale at our first home volleyball game on Tuesday, September 8 and our first home football game on Friday, September 4, or may be purchased from Pam in the office at any time. These tickets are good only for regularly scheduled home games, not tournaments anywhere or any away games.

THESE TICKETS DO NOT ADMIT COLLEGE STUDENTS BACK FOR THE SUMMER OR ANY CHILDREN NOT IN SCHOOL FOR SOME OTHER REASON. Preschoolers are admitted free.

PAYMENT OF FEES

Pam Nebel and Becky Hughes will be on duty daily Monday through Friday beginning August 10. They will collect your fees whenever it is convenient for you to stop in. We would appreciate your early attention to these obligations to avoid a rush the day school starts.

BUS INFORMATION

The Farragut Community School District Board of Directors has authorized the use of video cameras on school district buses. The video cameras will be used to monitor student behavior to maintain order on the school buses to promote and maintain a safe environment. Student and parents are hereby notified that the content of the videotapes may be used in a student disciplinary proceeding. The content of the videotapes are confidential student records and will be retained with other student records. Videotapes will only be retained if necessary for use in a student disciplinary proceeding or other matter as determined to be necessary by the administration. Parents may request to view videotapes of their child if the videotapes are used in a disciplinary proceeding involving their child.

OPEN ENROLLMENT

Parents or guardians intending to open enroll students in or out of the resident district must complete all application materials by March 1 of the year proceeding the school year of the student's open enrollment. For example, to open enroll during the 2010-2011 school year, the open enrollment application must be completed by March 1 of 2010. An open enrollment request for a prospective kindergarten student may be filed with the receiving district by September 1 of the school year of enrollment into kindergarten. Contact [Jay D. NOTICE TO PARENTS:

1. If you move from the district you currently live in during the term of the open enrollment, it is your responsibility to notify your resident district and the district to which you are moving.
2. Approval for one child in a family does not guarantee approval for younger children in the same family. Each child in a family must have an open enrollment request filed for him/her.
3. If your income is below 160% of the federal poverty guidelines, you qualify for transportation assistance. This may be in the form of actual transportation or a reimbursement paid directly to you.
4. A pupil who transfers school districts under open enrollment in all grades 10 through 12, shall not be eligible to participate in varsity interscholastic contests and competitions during the first 90 school days of transfer. Make sure your child's immunizations are current and that a record is on file at school.

The administration and staff is looking forward to a great year. With the cooperation of all parents and students involved, it proves to be an exciting year in the education of your children. Whenever you have questions, we hope that you will immediately contact the school to discuss whatever situations may arise.

FARRAGUT CSD - HOMELESS POLICY

If your family lives in any of the following situations, then your preschool-aged and school-aged children have certain rights or protections under the McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Assistance Act of 2001:

- In a shelter, motel, vehicle, or campground
- On the street
- In an abandoned building, trailer, or other inadequate accommodations
- Doubled up with friends or relatives because you cannot find or afford housing

Your children have the right to:

- Go to school, no matter where you live or how long you have lived there. They must be given access to the same public education, including preschool education provided to other children.
- Continue in the school they attended before you became homeless or the school they last attended, if that is your choice and feasible. If a school sends your child to a school other than the one you request, the school must provide you with a written explanation and offer you the right to appeal the decision.
- Receive transportation to the school your child (ren) attended before your family became homeless or the school they last attended, if you or a guardian requests such transportation.
- Attend a school and participate in school programs with children who are not homeless. Children cannot be separated from the regular school program because they are homeless.
- Enroll in school without giving a permanent address. Schools cannot require proof of residency that might prevent or delay school enrollment.
- Enroll and attend classes while the school arranges for the transfer of school and immunization records or any other documents required for enrollment.

- Enroll and attend classes in the school of your choice even while the school and you seek to resolve a dispute over enrolling your children.
- Receive the same special programs and services, if needed, as provided to all other children served in these programs.
- Receive transportation to school and to school programs.

When you move, you should do the following:

- Contact the school district's local liaison for homeless education (see phone number below) for help in enrolling your child in a new school or arranging for your child to continue in his or her former school. (Or, someone at a shelter, social services office, or the school can direct you to the person you need to contact.)
- Contact the school and provide any information you think will assist the teachers in helping your child adjust to new circumstances.
- Ask the local liaison for homeless education, the shelter provider, or a social worker for assistance with clothing and supplies, if needed.
